The Guild Chapel is located on the corner of Chapel Lane and Church Street.

Parking: There are many car parks in Stratford upon Avon town and on-street parking too. Blue badge users have free use of Stratford District Council car parks and for On street parking too. See our Access Statement.

Trains: Stratford upon Avon Town station is ½ mile away and Stratford-upon-Avon Parkway is 1 mile from the centre of town.

Buses: There are several bus services operating in Stratford-upon-Avon.


Stratford Park & Ride is situated at Bishopton, CV37 9QY.

Toilets: There are no toilets or baby-changing facilities at the Guild Chapel. The nearest public toilets, which include an accessible toilet [Radar key required] and baby change facilities are at Waterside and in the Theatre Gardens, near Holy Trinity Church.

ONCE YOU'RE HERE

Talks & Tours: Our volunteers are always happy to provide information to visitors about the Chapel. Tours and group talks can also be arranged by appointment. Stratford Town Walks also visit the Chapel as part of their programme.

Information: A range of information regarding the history of the Chapel, its contents and our conservation work is ongoing and ever changing. A variety of materials are provided within the Chapel itself as well as being available online and we endeavour to provide as wide a range as possible to suit visitors.

Events: Holy Communion is held at the Chapel at 10am every Wednesday. A variety of other events are held at the Guild Chapel every month, including music, poetry and family activities. Please visit TBC for information and timings on our latest events.

Access to and within the Guild Chapel

The pavements are uneven around the entrance. There is a 125mm (5") step into the Guild Chapel and 2 ramps are kept inside the Porch for use by wheelchair and mobility

scooter users, as they take you across the pavement too. The weight capacity for the ramps is TBC. The Guild Chapel is level throughout.

Ramps can either be requested from Guild Chapel volunteers upon arrival or by telephone in advance. If you require ramped access and wish to ensure it is available for your visit then please contact us on 01789 207111.
